A-WH ---Farm and Home Service with Controlled Water Heater **RATE PER UNIT**

Special Rules

1. The consumer shall install and operate in regular use a standard approved storage type of electric water heater and shall have no non-electric household water heating device in use during any part of the year (such as heating coils in a fuel burning range or furnace).

2. Provision shall be made in the consumer's water heater wiring installation for an automatic control device which the Cooperative may install at its discretion.

3. The standard approved type of water heater shall consist of an insulated tank of 30 or more gallons capacity, which has two thermostatically controlled, non-inductive heating elements of not less than 20 watts per gallon of tank capacity in the lower element and 30 watts per gallon of tank capacity in the upper element. The thermostats shall be so arranged to allow only one element to operate at a time. The lower element shall be placed to heat the whole tank and the upper element to heat only the upper part of the tank. The entire installation shall be subject to the approval of the Cooperative including the wiring, tank size, tank insulation and capacity in watts of the heating elements.

4. The lower element shall be arranged for control by a device which shall be set so that the lower element may operate not more than 18 hours per day and be automatically disconnected during the remaining hours. The hours of disconnection shall be determined from time to time and shall be the hours of system peak load. The upper element shall not be controlled. Element sizes must not exceed the following:

The billing demand shall be the maximum average kilowatt load used by the consumer for any period of fifteen consecutive minutes during the month for which the bill is rendered, as indicated or recorded by a demand meter.

Power Factor

The consumer agrees to maintain unity power factor as nearly as practicable. Power factor may be measured at any time. Should such measurements indicate that the power factor at the time of his maximum demand is less than 85% the demand for billing purposes shall be the demand as indicated or recorded by the demand meter multiplied by 85% and divided by the per cent power factor.

Where the Cooperative is required to extend or re-enforce its distribution facilities, it may increase the minimum charge is increased in accordance with the terms of this section additional energy and demand shall be included in accordance with the foregoing rate schedule.

Temporary Service

Temporary service shall be supplied in accordance with the foregoing rate except that the consumer shall pay in addition to the foregoing charges the total cost of connecting and disconnecting service less the value of materials returned to stock. The Cooperative may require a deposit, in advance, of the full amount of the estimated bill for service, including the cost of connection and disconnection.

Delayed Payment Charge

The above rates are net, the gross rates being five percent (5%) higher. In the event the current monthly bill is not paid by the 10th of the month following the meter reading date, the gross rate shall then apply.

Special Rules

1. Consumers having their homes on the same premises with their business establishments may include service for both on the same meter in which case all service will be billed under this schedule using the rate set out above. If the consumer prefers, he may make provision for two meters, in which case his usage for residential purposes will be billed under the appropriate residential schedule and rate, and his usage for business purposes will be billed under this schedule and rate.

2. Motors having a rated capacity in excess of ten horsepower (10 h.p.) must be three-phase.

The minimum annual charge under the above rate shall be \$12.00 where 3 kva or less of transformer capacity is required. For consumers requiring more than 3 kva of transformer capacity, the minimum annual charge shall be increased at the rate of \$9.00 for each additional kva or fraction thereof required, in which event a corresponding amount of additional energy shall be included in accordance with the foregoing rate.

SPECIAL RULES

1. Motors having a rated capacity in excess of ten horse power (10 h. p.) must be three-phase.
2. Both power and lighting shall be billed at the foregoing rates. If a separate meter is required for the lighting circuit the registrations of the two watt-hour meters shall be added to obtain the total kilowatt demand for billing purposes.
3. All wiring, pole lines, and other electrical equipment beyond the metering point, shall be considered the distribution system of the consumer and shall be furnished and maintained by the consumer.
4. If service is furnished at primary distribution voltage, discount of ten percent (10%) shall apply to the demand and energy charges, and if the minimum charge is based on transformer capacity, a discount of 10% shall also apply to the minimum charge. However, the Corporation shall have the option of metering at secondary voltage and adding the estimated transformer losses to the metered kilowatt hours and kilowatt demand. 1-22-63

IN ADDITION TO THE STIPULATIONS SET OUT IN THE FOREGOING RATE SCHEDULES THE FOLLOWING RULES AND REGULATION ARE IN EFFECT AND PRACTICED ON THIS COOPERATIVE ALL OF WHICH HAVING PREVIOUSLY BEEN APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE COOPERATIVE.

1. Bills to be sent out on or before first day of each month.
2. Electric energy bills are due and payable from first through tenth of each month.
3. Delinquent letters to be sent out not later than 14th of each month.
4. Collection date on delinquent accounts to be 21st of each month.
5. The money or the meter to be secured on 21st by collector.
6. A \$2.00 fee is to be collected on first call and on all subsequent calls for purpose of collecting delinquent accounts.
7. No consumer is never to be reconnected at any location without first being paid up to date on all previous indebtedness to Cooperative.
8. Invoice statement to be issued on or before 15th of following month covering each delinquent account.
9. On 1st of next following month all unpaid invoice statement are to be turned over to attorney for further proceedings, provided such amount exceeds the membership fee.
10. When checks are returned from bank marked "Insufficient Funds" the drawer of said check is to be notified by letter and his service placed on the cut-off list along with other delinquent accounts and followed through with in the same procedure as outlined above.
11. Also, it is understood that all consumers are to be members of Cooperative and cases of failure to pay membership fee shall be treated in the same manner as outlined above on delinquent accounts.
12. When a member is delinquent and the Project so desires, it may require any member to deposit not more than the estimated electric bills for two months, and in certain cases of temporary service and/or questionable cases an advance deposit of two months estimated consumption may be charged for at the time of service connect. Such advance payments may be refunded or consumed in and for electric energy used after 24 months of prompt payment.

TEMPORARY SERVICE AND SERVICE TO CONSUMERS WHICH MAY
BE OF ABNORMALLY SHORT DURATION

Temporary service may be supplied in accordance with the existing adopted and approved rate schedules of the Cooperative except that the consumer shall pay, in addition to the regular rates, the total cost of connecting and disconnecting service less the value of materials returned to stock. A deposit, in advance may be required of the full amount of the estimated bill for service, including the cost of connection and disconnection.

Also, in cases of service to power the pumping of oil wells and the operation of oil fields, and any and all other types of consumer services which may be of short duration, the Farmers Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation must and shall protect its investments on same in the following manner: The consumer shall, at the time he makes application for such service, pay a deposit to the Cooperative, in each instance, an amount equal to the cost of construction and retirement, covering both material and labor involved, less salvage value on all material retired into stock. This deposit can and may be refunded at the rate of ten percent (10%) of the consumer's monthly power bills thereafter.

In case of a transfer of the lease or ownership on an oil well or other property the parties involved can make the necessary arrangements regarding the transfer of the deposit and settlement of same.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. SCOPE

This Schedule of Rules and Regulations is a part of all contracts for receiving electric service from the Cooperative and applies to all service received from the Cooperative whether the service received is based upon a contract, agreement, signed application, or otherwise. No employee or individual director of the Cooperative is permitted to make an exception to rates or Rules and Regulations. Rates and service information can be obtained from the Cooperative's office.

2. REVISIONS

These Rules and Regulations may be revised, amended, supplemented or otherwise changed from time to time without notice. Such changes when effective shall have the same force as the present Rules and Regulations. The members shall be informed of any changes as soon as possible, after adoption by the Board of Directors, through the Cooperative's monthly newsletter.

3. CONSUMER'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR COOPERATIVE'S PROPERTY

All meters, service connections, and other equipment furnished by the Cooperative shall be, and remain, the property of the Cooperative. The member shall exercise proper care to protect the property of the Cooperative on its premises and in the event of loss or damage to the Cooperative's property arising from neglect of member to care for same, the cost of necessary repairs or replacement shall be paid by the member.

4. CONTINUITY OF SERVICE / - 22 - 63

The Cooperative shall use reasonable diligence to provide a constant and uninterrupted supply of electric power and energy, but if such supply shall fail or be interrupted or become defective through act of God, or the public enemy, or by accident, strikes, labor troubles, or by action of the elements, or inability to secure rights-of-way or other permits needed, or for any other cause beyond the reasonable control of the Cooperative, the Cooperative shall not be liable therefor.

5. RELOCATION OF LINES BY REQUEST OF MEMBERS

The Cooperative's established lines will not be relocated unless the expense for moving and relocating is paid by the member, except in instances where it would be to the advantage of the Cooperative to make such relocation.

6. SERVICES PERFORMED FOR MEMBERS

The Cooperative's personnel is prohibited from making repairs or performing services to the members equipment or property except in cases of emergency or to protect the public or member's person, or property. When such emergency services are performed the member shall be charged for such service at the rate of time and material.

7. APPLICATION FOR SERVICE

Each prospective member desiring electric service will be required to sign the Cooperative's form, "Application for Membership and For Electric Service," before service is supplied by the Cooperative and provide the Cooperative with necessary easements or right-of-way permits.

8. MEMBERSHIP FEE

The membership fee in the Corporation shall be \$5.00 (Five Dollars), upon the payment of which a member shall be eligible for one service connection. A service connection fee of five dollars shall be charged for each additional service connection. The membership fee will be refunded if all bills are paid or applied against any unpaid bills of the member at the time service is discontinued, which will automatically terminate the membership. Service covered by each meter shall be metered and billed separately.

9. RIGHT OF ACCESS) - 22 - 6

The Cooperative's identified employees shall have access to member's premises at all reasonable times for the purpose of reading meter, testing, repairing, removing, or exchanging any and all equipment belonging to the Cooperative.

10. MEMBER'S DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE

Any member desiring service discontinued or changed from one location to another shall give the Cooperative three (3) days notice in person or in writing provided such notice does not violate contractual obligations.

11. TEMPORARY SERVICE

Temporary service may be supplied in accordance with the existing adopted and approved rate schedules of the Cooperative except that the consumer shall pay, in addition to the regular rates, the total cost of connecting and disconnecting service less the value of materials returned to stock. A deposit, in advance may be required of the full amount of the estimated bill for service, including the cost of connection and disconnection.

12. SERVICE TO CONSUMERS WHICH MAY BE OF SHORT DURATION

Also, in cases of service to power the pumping of oil wells and the operation of oil fields, and any and all other types of consumer services which may be of short duration, the Farmers Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation must and shall protect its investments on same in the following manner:

The consumer shall, at the time he makes application for such service, pay a deposit to the Cooperative, in each instance, an amount equal to the cost of construction and retirement, covering both material and labor involved, less salvage value on all material retired into stock. This deposit can and may be refunded at the rate of ten percent (10%) of the consumer's monthly power bills thereafter.

In case of a transfer of the lease or ownership on an oil well or other property the parties involved can make the necessary arrangements regarding the transfer of the deposit and settlement of same.

13. METER TESTS

1 - 22 - 63
All new meters shall be checked for accuracy before installation. The Cooperative will, at its own expense, make periodical tests and inspections of its meters in order to maintain a high standard of accuracy and to conform with the regulations of the Public Service Commission. The Cooperative will make additional tests of meters at the request of the member upon payment of a fee of \$2.50 (Two Dollars and Fifty Cents) paid in advance. When the test made at the member's request shows that the meter is accurate within 2% slow or fast, no adjustment will be made to the member's bill and the fee paid will be forfeited to cover cost of requested test. When the test shows the meter to be in excess of 2% fast or slow, an adjustment shall be made to the member's bill by recalculating the monthly bills for a period equal to one half (1/2) of the time lapsed since the last previous test, but in no case shall

this period exceed twelve (12) months and the cost of testing the meter found to be inaccurate will be borne by the Cooperative and the \$2.50 (Two Dollars and Fifty Cents) fee paid by the member will be refunded.

14. FAILURE OF METER TO REGISTER

In the event a member's meter should fail to register, the member shall be billed from the date of such failure at the average consumption of the member based on the three (3) month period immediately preceding the failure.

15. DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE BY COOPERATIVE

The Cooperative may refuse to connect or discontinue service to a member for the violation of any of its rules and regulations. The Cooperative may discontinue service to a member for the theft of current or the appearance of current-theft devices on the premises of the member. The discontinuance of service by the Cooperative for any cause stated in this rule does not release the member of his obligation of all bills due.

16. POINT OF DELIVERY

The point of delivery is the point as designated by the Cooperative on member's premises where current is to be delivered to building or premises namely the meter. All wiring and equipment beyond this point of delivery shall be supplied and maintained by the member. The member will, however, notify the Cooperative of any proposed changes in his equipment or wiring which will materially increase or decrease his load so the Cooperative may check its equipment to make certain it will accommodate the consumer's load requirement.

17. CONSUMER'S WIRING

All wiring of the member must conform to Cooperative's requirements and accepted modern standards. The member agrees to construct its facilities in accordance with specifications at least equal to those prescribed by the National Electric Safety Code and the Bureau of Standards. The Cooperative, however, assumes no responsibility in respect to the type, standard of construction, protective equipment or the condition of the member's property, and will not be liable for any loss or injury to persons or property occurring on the premises or

property of the member. The member agrees to operate and maintain its facilities so as not to interfere with the service of the Cooperative to its other members. The member will have complete responsibility for all construction, operation, and maintenance beyond the meter and will save the Cooperative harmless against liability for injury or damages resulting in any manner from construction, location, operation, or maintenance of the member's facilities.

18. METER POLE INSTALLATION

Meter pole installations must be provided with a main fuse switch or circuit breaker mounted below the meter, having capacity of the total diversified load which the meter pole will serve. Meter poles will be supplied by the Cooperative where the diversified load which the meter pole will serve exceeds 70 amperes. All installations and wiring of the meter pole must meet National Electric Code, and requirements of the Cooperative.

19. INSPECTION

All consumers wiring must be inspected before connection for service by the Cooperative. Fee for such inspection shall be paid at the Cooperative's office. The lines of the Cooperative are not to be connected to said premises; provided that this rule shall not apply where temporary service is desired on a pole or temporary building during the construction of any permanent building and service is to be of a temporary nature only.

20. BILLING

Members will receive statements for electric service on or about the first day of each month for service rendered for the month ending the first of the preceding month. All statements are due and payable upon receipt and shall be paid at the office of the Cooperative within fifteen (15) days. Failure to receive electrical statement will not release the member from payment obligation.

21. METER READING

Each member receiving service will be required to supply the Cooperative with the reading of each meter on the form as furnished by the Cooperative, on such date as designated by the Cooperative. Upon failure by the member to supply the Cooperative with such meter reading for three (3) consecutive

meter reading dates the Cooperative shall act by having its representative read the member's meter and a service charge of \$2.50 (Two Dollars and Fifty Cents) will be made for the extra service rendered. In the event that an error in meter reading should be made or member fails to send in meter reading card, the member shall pay for that month either the minimum bill for the service which he receives or an amount approximately equal to his average bill.

22. MINIMUM ANNUAL CHARGE FOR SEASONAL SERVICE

Consumers requiring service only during certain seasons not exceeding 9 months per year may guarantee a minimum annual payment of 12 times the minimum monthly charge determined in accordance with the rate applicable, in which case there shall be no minimum monthly charge. Payment of minimum annual charge shall entitle the consumer to the use of the corresponding number of kilowatt-hours in accordance with the rate applicable.

Charges shall be computed each month during which service is used in accordance with the rate applicable. The minimum annual charge shall be paid in advance each year before service is connected. No deduction shall be allowed for payments in excess of the minimum annual charge during the previous season. In case the consumer requires more than 3 kva transformer capacity, the minimum annual charge shall be increased at the rate of \$9.00 (Nine Dollars) per additional kva. The Cooperative may also charge for the cost of connecting and disconnecting this type of service.

LIGHTING LEASE AGREEMENT

The Farmers Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation, hereinafter called the Cooperative, and _____ a member of the Cooperative, hereby mutually agree as follows:

1. Cooperative will furnish and install at no expense to the member, a lighting unit on a thirty foot pole at a location suitable to both parties; will make all necessary electrical connections and will furnish electricity for same which shall be controlled by a photo cell to energize the unit. Cooperative will replace ____ Watt Mercury Vapor lamp for a flat fee of \$_____.

2. The member hereby agrees to furnish the location for the unit; to permit any tree trimming required for the conductors or unit installation and will pay for the foregoing service at the rate of _____ each and every month as billed on the regular electric bills.

3. The member further agrees that the unit, together with the poles and conductors may be removed at any time by the Cooperative upon failure to pay the charges set forth herein.

4. Further, the member agrees to protect the unit from damage so far as said member is able. The member will be held liable for vandalism or willful destruction of this unit.

5. It is mutually agreed that the unit as installed remains the property of the Cooperative and will be removed at the request of the member upon the anniversary date of this agreement in any year. The minimum such period shall be one year, for which member agrees to pay as set forth herein.

CONSUMER COLLECTING POLICY

1. Bills to be sent out on or before first day of each month.
2. Electric energy bills are due and payable from first through fifteenth of each month.
3. Delinquent letters to be sent out on or about the 18th of each month.
4. Collection date on delinquent accounts to be on or about the 23rd of each month.
5. The money or the meter to be secured on collection date.
6. A \$2.50 fee is to be collected on first call and on all subsequent calls for purpose of collecting delinquent accounts.
7. No consumer is to be reconnected at any location without first being paid up to date on all previous indebtedness to Cooperative.
8. Invoice statement to be issued on or about 18th of following month covering each delinquent account.
9. On 1st of next following month all unpaid invoice statements are to be turned over to attorney for further proceedings, provided such amount exceeds the membership fee.
10. When checks are returned from bank marked "Insufficient Funds" the drawer of said check is to be notified by letter and his service placed on the cut-off list along with other delinquent accounts and followed through with in the same procedure as outlined above.
11. Also, it is understood that all consumers are to be members of Cooperative and cases of failure to pay membership fee shall be treated in the same manner as outlined above on delinquent accounts.
12. When a member is delinquent and the Cooperative so desires, it may require any member to deposit not more than the estimated electric bills for two months, and in certain cases of temporary service and/or questionable cases an advance deposit of two months estimated consumption may be charged for at the time of service connect. Such advance payments may be refundable or consumed in and for electric energy used after 24 months of prompt payment.
