



# ENERGY 101

## The importance of good insulation

Better insulation equals better comfort in all areas of your home—and can help lower your energy bills

Did you know that heat flows naturally from a warmer space to a cooler space? Insulation's job is to block that flow so you'll be more comfortable in your home year-

round. And good insulation also means that your home's heating and air-conditioning systems won't have to run as often.

During the winter, heat moves directly from your living spaces to adjacent unheated attics, garages, basements, and even outdoors. It can also travel indirectly through interior ceilings, walls, and floors, anywhere there's a difference in temperature. During the summer, the opposite

happens—heat flows from the exterior to the interior of your home.

Properly installed insulation creates resistance to heat flow, and is measured or rated in terms of its R-value. The higher the R-value, the greater the insulation's effectiveness. The more heat flow resistance your insulation provides, the lower your heating and cooling costs will be.

A well-insulated home is one of the most cost-effective means of saving energy and lowering your energy bills.


